Currently places are offered to our vulnerable SEND children, as this is an opportunity to offer a more targeted support due to class sizes being so small. An opportunity to close the gaps in their learning, and build on their well-being and confidence. I know that some of you are worried about the spread of the virus, and understand that you may wish to keep them at home, which is why we are working hard at making sure our Blended Learning supports their needs. However, this can be difficult, as responsibility is passed on to the parent for making sure that their child accesses their online learning daily; and for some parents who have other children in the household, this can be difficult, especially when your child has additional learning needs. This is why we offer a place in school, as all children need to be accessing learning and this will be monitored daily by their class teacher. If you are concerned about any area of your child's learning while they are at home, please let us know so that we can help in a way forward so that your child does not miss out on their education and ensure they are prepared for next stage of their education and adulthood.
