Parents evening

It was great to see so many parents attend out parents' evenings on Tuesday and Thursday this week. This year we made sure that the Scholastic Book Fair was available and on Thursday also invited the Great Yarmouth Mental Support team and Family Network Hub to attend. Having these organisations attend allows parents and carers to get advice on any issues they have and look for support. We plan to continue having groups like this attend and would welcome any feedback from parents on how our parents' evenings operate and what other organisations or services they would find useful to attend.

NSPCC - Speak Out Stay Safe

This week the whole of the academy were involved in the NSPCC (National Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Children) Speak Out Stay Safe Programme. This programme helps to teach children to stay safe and recognise forms of abuse. Some of the activities covered included:

- **KS1 - About Buddy** - We talk about how Buddy is a speech bubble because we believe children should speak out if they have any worries.
- **KS2 - Sack of worries** - We talk about the types of worries a child might have. We use bricks to represent worries and put them in the sack. We then use the sack of worries to talk about safe adults a child could talk to. With each example, a brick is removed.

On the Wednesday 24th April we are having a Maths day. **Dress Up** – we are encouraging pupils (and staff) to come to school dressed up as their TTRS avatar or something Maths themed for £1.00. **Cake Sale** – there will be a cake sale for pupils at breaktime. **During the Day** – there will be lots of activities and challenges throughout the day for pupils to have a go at!
